

We know you'd like to recycle your Christmas tree, so we gathered some info about how you can do so:

Colerain Township offers Christmas tree recycling through Saturday, Jan. 31.

Drop-off sites locations are: Colerain Township Senior and Community Center rear lot, 4300 Springdale Road, Skyline Community Center, 8500 Pippin Road and Clippard Park, 10213 Dewhill.

For all **Hamilton County** residents, the following drop-off sites will be open on Saturday, Jan. 8, and Saturday, Jan. 15, from noon to 3 p.m.

* West: Kuliga Park at 6717 Bridgetown Road in Green Township

* North: Rumpke Sanitary Landfill at Struble Road and Colerain Avenue, Colerain Township.

Cincinnati residents can leave their tree at the curb on their normal waste collection days through Jan 14.

The **Deerfield Township** Tree Recycling Program has three different drop-off locations. Residents there can drop off their live trees at Fleckenstein Park on Mason-Montgomery Road, Cottell Park on Irwin-Simpson Road and Landen Station on State Route 22. The trees will be mulched and used in township parks.

The **City of Fairfield** is accepting trees at Waterworks Park on Groh Lane.

Residents in **West Chester** can drop their trees off at Keehner Park.

The cities of **Hamilton, Monroe** and **Oxford** all will chip trees left for curbside pickup.

Remember to remove all ornaments, lights or tinsel before taking your tree to a drop-off or setting it out at the curb!
