Garden Tasks

- Go through your remaining seed packets and determine what you will need for fall planting.
- Harvest produce as it ripens so your garden doesn't attract scavengers. Share the bounty with neighbors.
- Visit the garden often to ensure it isn't becoming a wild weed patch and things are being watered.
- Check for pests on plants and use IPM to prevent a major infestation.
