June

Garden Tasks

- Continue to plant cucumbers, melons, peppers, pumpkins, sunflowers, tomatoes, zinnias, etc. to ensure a harvest when the students return.
- Weed and thin around desired plants to ensure proper growth.
- Water the garden regularly, so crops get 1"/week.
- If you are leaving your garden to rest for the summer, pull out all of the remaining plants and put them in the compost. Cover the bed with a barrier.
