Garden Tasks

- Pull out spent plants and add them to the compost.
- Save seeds from flowers and summer crops to plant next year.
- Last chance to plant spring blooming bulbs, trees and perennials.
- Cover any bare soil in your raised beds with leaves or straw.
- Install season extenders like cold frames or low tunnels to protect your cold hardy crops.
